

THE HISTORY OF RACING IN WARRNAMBOOL - FROM 1848

RACING, AND A REGION'S GRAND STORY

Mark McNamara's near-30-year toil has produced a book of more than 400 pages that is an amazing and well-researched story of more than a century and a half of horse-racing history in Warrnambool that also is a history of the region's people and their sporting passion.

The magnificent **Grand Annual Steeplechase** takes centre stage at Warrnambool's annual three-day May carnival, and it is covered extensively in Melbourne barrister McNamara's much wider labour of love.

As the proud Warrnambool man and highly respected former chief steward, Des Gleeson, says in his foreword: "The carnival's Grand Annual Steeplechase is the ultimate test of horse and rider, run over an exhausting 5500 metres with 33 obstacles, more than any other steeplechase in the world. It is a spectacle unmatched, conducted through open paddocks and up and down hills, horses running clockwise and anti-clockwise at different stages."

The book covers the Annual and the other iconic carnival races, the Warrnambool Cup, the Wangoom Handicap, the Brierly Steeplechase and the Galleywood Hurdle. Warrnambool-born McNamara tells of the exploits of the great horses, including Galleywood, for whom the hurdle was named, and delves into the fight to save jumps racing.

It details the exploits of trainers such big winners Kevin Lafferty and Darren Weir, the great jockeys such as Tom Corrigan and Ted Byrne, and the jockey- trainer combinations such as **Pat Hyland** and **Jim Moloney**. Horse owners **Tozer**, **Manifold** and more provide key moments, right from the mid-1800s when many rode their own horses in races as amateurs and also were involved—as or with administrators—in the establishment of clubs and Warrnambool's racecourses.

Crisp Steeple - 3900m • Grand National Hurdle - 4200m

HISTORY

Crisp – also known as the Black Kangaroo – was inducted into the Australian Hall of Fame in 2013

Crisp was bred and raced by Sir Chester Manifold, one of racing's most prominent administrators. He served 11 years as chairman of the Victoria Racing Club (VRC), from 1951 to 1962, and was also the first chairman of the Totalisator Agency Board – our modern TAB – in Victoria. Manifold was a successful owner and breeder, with Crisp his best galloper. Foaled in 1963, Crisp was by Rose Argent – a black type winner in the United Kingdom – out of the well-bred mare Wheat Germ.

Trained by Des Judd, he showed very little on the flat at two and three and his future was in doubt.

However, in 1968, he won five races over the hurdles, before he was switched to the bigger fences as a steeplechaser. Battling the handicapper, he managed to win the Hiskens Steeplechase at Moonee Valley two years in a row, winning by 20 lengths under 70kg in 1969 before winning by 12 lengths under 76.5kg in 1970.

The Hiskens Steeplechase would be Crisp's last start on Australian soil (11 wins, 5 seconds). Crisp was virtually 'weighted-out' of racing in Australia and Sir Chester wasn't prepared to risk his champion with the crippling burdens he was being asked to carry. So with the handicapper having the better of Crisp, it was decided to give the Black Kangaroo his opportunity on the National Hunt scene in England, where (arguably) jumps racing is bigger than flat racing.

Transferred to Fred Winter, but still owned by his Australian connections, Crisp made an impact straight away.

His first major victory was the the 1971 Cheltenham Festival when he won what is now the Queen Mother Champion Chase, for the best two mile chasers around. He demolished his opposition, racing away for a 25 length victory.

The following year, he was entered for Cheltenham's premier race, the Cheltenham Gold Cup over a distance of 3 miles 2 1/2 furlongs (approximately 5300m). However, he seemed to find the distance too far, grinding home for fifth behind Glencaraig Lady.

Incredibly, the following season, the plan was to step Crisp up in distance, with the Grand National the target.

The Grand National is one of the world's most arduous races. Run at Aintree, just outside Liverpool, it is a gruelling four miles and four furlongs (approximately 7250m) taking in two laps of the infamous National Course. It is the Melbourne Cup of the National Hunt season, run under handicap conditions, with the Cheltenham Gold Cup the Cox Plate equivalent.

The 1973 Grand National is as much remembered for Crisp's run-in defeat as it was for Red Rum's narrow victory. Crisp began to tire badly on the 494-yard run-in, carrying 23 lb more than his nearest rival. Red Rum made up considerable ground, and two strides from the finishing post he pipped Crisp by three-quarters of a length to win his first of three Grand National titles. To describe Crisp's performance as extraordinary is a devastating understatement. He was brutal, bold and brave. And yet, he didn't win. It was as good a run, if not significantly better, than any of his wins.

Crisp ran three times in the season after his second in the 1973 National. He won a two and a half mile chase at Newbury beating two mile champion chaser Royal Relief; and a third place in a 2-mile Hurdle at Worcester. Then, at Doncaster, he had a match race, at level weights, against his old foe Red Rum. With a twenty three pound weight turnaround from Aintree, Crisp won by eight lengths.

JJ Houlahan Hurdle - 3900m • Grand National Steeple - 4200m



Born on 14 May 1913, Jim Houlahan grew up around horses and it was at the family property just out of Bendigo that he developed his horsemanship.

And while he will be forever remembered as one of Australian racing's all-time great trainers, Jim's early career was in building and property development. During this time he maintained an interest in horses, owning several flat racers and trotters, but by his own accord Jim was "a bloody pest as an owner, always sticking my nose in". Often his well meaning advice was coolly received, which ultimately led to the spawning of the greatest jumps training career Australia has seen.

After observing that his horse The Smoodger had not eaten well one morning, Jim questioned the trainer's intention to continue to gallop the horse. The infuriated trainer told Jim that if he thought he could do better he should have a go himself. Jim took up the challenge and went to the stable each day to walk the horse, not allowing it to gallop once.

Two weeks later the horse was saddled up for a race in Seymour and won easily.

It was another argument over a horse that finally prompted Jim to take out his owner/trainer licence in 1970 at the age of 57.

Jim had sold a New Zealand-bred polo pony named **Bellaron** and it was just a few weeks later than the new owner returned the horse to Jim, insisting that it was useless.

Jim argued that the horse had real potential and with typical Houlahan determination resolved to train the horse as a jumper himself. Bellarron went on to win eight races in the following 12 months.

Encouraged by his success Jim devoted himself to training. Together with his son Mark, he set up a facility at his Boneo property, Yarraman Park. Jim ensured that Yarraman Park provided a suitable environment for training winners. Facilities included a training track, horse swimming pool, and a large stable. Nature provided a steep rise ideal for a tough workout and there were plenty of logs for schooling the horses in jumping.

Houlahan's first major win came in 1977 when he won the Grand National Steeplechase with Strasbourg and went on to build an unparalleled record in jumps races.

Among his feature race wins were eight Australian Hurdles, two Australian Steeplechases, seven Grand National Hurdles, one Grand National Steeplechases, four A.V. Hiskens Steeplechases, four Warrnambool Grand Annual Steeplechases and three Oakbank Great Eastern Steeplechases.

Some of his greatest horses included Moon Chase, Marlborough, Cold Reason, Planet Hollywood and The Shu.

He also enjoyed success on the flat at the elite level, winning the Group 1 Goodwood Handicap at Morphettville with Bellzevir.

An incredible feature-race honour roll is not Houlahan's only legacy to the racing industry. One of his four children, Fran, is a respected Victorian trainer and in 2003 emulated the deeds of her father when she prepared **Sampan Man** to win the Grand Annual Steeplechase at Warrnambool.

In 2004 Jim received an **Order of Australia Medal** for service to the horse racing industry and the community. In the same year he was inducted into the **Australian Racing Hall of Fame**.

Jim retired from training in 2005 at the age of 92 and passed away on 4 April 2007 at the age of 93.

To honour his extraordinary career and contribution to the sport, Racing Victoria Limited in 2006 launched the JJ Houlahan Jumps Championship. Comprising the top 15 feature jumps races on the Australian calendar, the J.J. Houlahan Jumps Championship recognises the leading horse, trainer and jockey of the racing season.
