Karasi inducted into the Australian Racing Hall of Fame

Champion steeplechaser Karasi has become only the second jumps horse in Australian Racing history to be inducted into the Australian Racing Hall of Fame after the mighty Crisp in 2013.

Karasi is a Bay Gelding bred in Ireland by the Aga Khan and foaled in February 1995. He is the son of the Epsom Derby and Irish Derby winner Kahyasi from Karamita winner of the Princess Royal Stakes at Ascot.

He was originally trained in the UK by Sir Michael Stout and won three races on the flat before being sent Down Under to be prepared by David Hall with the Melbourne Cup in mind, such was the opinion held of him. His form over the following two years was exemplary. He was second in the Adelaide Cup in 2000, third twice in the Brisbane Cup in 2000 and 2001, won the Geelong Cup in 2001 and topped all that off with a great fourth to Ethereal in the Melbourne Cup.

In 2002 he returned for a short campaign before injury forced him off the scene for 12 months. The following season after being unplaced in the 2003 Adelaide Cup and although only 15.1 hands he was sent to Eric Musgrove with a jumping career in mind.

Although he wasn't a natural at first it wasn't long before he was chalking up the wins including the Australian Hurdle and the South Australian Grand National before being transferred to Steeplechasing.

His debut over the bigger fences was in the A.V. Hiskens Steeplechase at Moonee Valley, which was considered the Cox Plate of jumping and ran a fast finishing third. This was to be his only steeple run in Australia as he was invited to fly

the flag in the rich 4250 metre Nakayama Grand Jump at Nakayama, Japan.

Meticulously prepared by Musgrove with the one race in mind he went on to win the next three Grand Jumps in 2005, 2006 and 2007. With the previous year's winner gaining automatic entry for the following year.

He was partnered each time by Champion Kiwi jockey Brett Scott, whose navigation of the tricky Nakayama course is legendary. Although the course follows a twisted path on the racecourse interior over a series of jumps, inclines and declines never seemed to leave the rails.

At age 13 the horse was so fit and well it was agreed that he should have a fourth attempt at the race and was right on track until a last minute injury

prevented him from taking his place in the field.

The devastated connections immediately decided that he had earned his retirement with a career record of 16 wins from 97 starts. His earnings of \$3,747,283 is a record for a steeplechaser. \$2.8 million of that having been won in Japan making him the highest Australian overseas stake money earner in history.

He is now living out that well earned retirement aged 23 at Eric Musgrove's property in South Eastern Victoria named in his honour - Karasi Park.

The cessation of jumps races by the VRC (after it held its 2009 Grand Nationals at Sandown) and at Moonee Valley necessitated several programming changes for the 2010 jumps season. Sunday 11 July 2010 saw the introduction of two new feature races at Warrnambool, the Tom Corrigan Hurdle and the Thackeray Steeplechase. Since 2011 the hurdle race has carried the name of Kevin Lafferty. Some champion jumpers have already won these races, including Wells and Bashboy – the only horses to have won three Grand National Steeplechases in the very long history of that race.

KEVIN JOSEPH LAFFERTY, the greatest trainer to call Warrnambool home in the 170-year history of horse racing at the seaside town, was born at Camperdown on 3 June 1912. One of the nuns who taught Kevin at St. Patrick's school in Port Fairy affectionately regarded him as "a clever lad but always too fond of horses". Upon leaving school Lafferty wanted to become a jockey but was too heavy. He rode as an amateur for several years, on the flat and over jumps. That phase of his career came to an abrupt halt after his left leg had to be amputated following a fall while riding with the Findon Hunt Club on Friday 13 July 1934. Lafferty then conducted a riding school in Hawthorn and became a part-time trainer for two or three years. He named his riding school the Findon Riding School, not after the Hunt Club with which he suffered a life-changing injury, but rather because he stabled his horses in Findon Street, Hawthorn.

Lafferty moved to Warrnambool in 1938. He obtained a trainer's license during the 1946/47 season, whilst continuing to work in the office at a local hardware store. The wins of **Royal Pentzia** and **Royal Pageant** in South Australia in the early 1950s enabled Lafferty to pursue his passion for training racehorses on a full-time basis. At Oakbank in 1952 **Royal Pentzia** won the **Von Doussa** and **Great Eastern Steeplechases**. Lafferty also won the **Harry D. Young Hurdle** with **Solvale**, and is the only trainer to have won Oakbank's three feature jumps races in one year. **Royal Pageant**, who Lafferty's good mate **Leo McMahon** sent to Lafferty to train as a jumper, won the 1953 **Adelaide Cup** by half a head.

Lafferty had great success with inexpensive horses and with horses that had broken down while trained by others. He was a strong believer in the recuperative powers of Warrnambool's Lady Bay and the variety provided by exercising horses on the beach. The limited room for boxes behind his home meant that Lafferty never had more than 18 horses in work at any one time. Remarkably, he turned out over 800 winners and won the SWDRA trainer's premiership 12 times.

From 1953 to 1967 Lafferty trained five **Brierly** winners and three **Grand Annual** winners. His Annual winners were **Mac Union** (1956), **Solight** (1957) and **Yes Sir** (1967). In 1957 he trained all three placegetters in the Brierly and the first two home in the Annual. Lafferty won the **Wangoom Handicap** in 1969 with **Stanaswa**, but the **Warrnambool Cup** eluded him until **Puramaka** broke that

drought in fine style, winning the race in 1977 and 1978. Lafferty died on 3 December 1987, aged 75.

THACKERAY, (**Hapful-Solamba**) was bred by MVRC treasurer **Bob Barr-Smith** with the specific intention of winning the **Grand Annual**. Barr-Smith named the gelding after the great English novelist William Makepeace Thackeray, rather than the mountain not far from his Willaura property where his daughter, **Rhoda Handyside**, taught Thackeray to jump by riding him over fallen logs and ditches. Thackeray was a maiden going into the 1979 Grand Annual, but had recorded six placings in seven starts over fences. He was ideally suited by the marathon journey, and came with such a strong finishing burst that jockey **Kevin Wynne**, who rode the runner-up, was moved to say,



"I thought he had just joined in ..." History was made with the first three horses home being trained by females: Rhoda Handyside (Thackeray), **Maureen Dwyer** (Follow The Band) and **Vi Kettlewell** (Coolgardie). **Butch Londregan** wasted for a fortnight to take the ride on Thackeray, which had only 57kg and which he rode 1.5kg over.

In 1980 Thackeray raced much closer to the lead in the Annual and defeated **Tournaite's Lad** and the **Great Eastern** winner, **Lord Rocky Red**. Thackeray returned to Warrnambool in 1981 seeking to become the first horse to win three Grand Annuals. He came close but was thwarted by a gun steeplechaser and an old mate who

did complete a hat-trick of Grand Annual wins. **Butch Londregan** lost the ride on Thackeray after Tasmanian Racing Club stewards disqualified him for four years in January 1981 following an inquiry into the running of the **Wrest Point Casino Hurdle** at Elwick the previous February. Londregan's disqualification was subsequently overturned, and he picked up the ride on **Kaimoto** in the 1981 Annual after his regular rider **Paul Hely** was injured. In a stirring finish the **Rick Hore-Lacy** trained Kaimoto held off a gallant Thackeray to win by three lengths.

Mark McNamara's near-30-year toil has produced a book of more than 400 pages that is an amazing and well-researched story of more than a century and a half of horse-racing history in Warrnambool that also is a history of the region's people and their sporting passion.

The magnificent **Grand Annual Steeplechase** takes centre stage at Warrnambool's annual three-day May carnival, and it is covered extensively in Melbourne barrister McNamara's much wider labour of love.

As the proud Warrnambool man and highly respected former chief steward, **Des Gleeson**, says in his foreword: "*The carnival's Grand Annual Steeplechase is the ultimate test of horse and rider, run over an exhausting 5500 metres with 33 obstacles, more than any other steeplechase in the world. It is a spectacle unmatched, conducted through open paddocks and up and down hills, horses running clockwise and anti-clockwise at different stages.*"

The book covers the Annual and the other iconic carnival races, the **Warrnambool Cup**, the **Wangoom Handicap**, the **Brierly Steeplechase** and the **Galleywood Hurdle**. Warrnambool-born McNamara tells of the exploits of the great horses, including **Galleywood**, for whom the hurdle was named, and delves into the fight to save jumps racing.

It details the exploits of trainers such big winners **Kevin Lafferty** and **Darren Weir**, the great jockeys such as **Tom Corrigan** and **Ted Byrne**, and the jockey- trainer com-

binations such as **Pat Hyland** and **Jim Moloney**. Horse owners **Tozer**, **Manifold** and more provide key moments, right from the mid-1800s when many rode their own horses in races as amateurs and also were involved—as or with administrators—in the establishment of clubs and Warrnambool's racecourses.

Big July at Warrnambool and Bendigo

24 JULY - BENDIGO

Brendan Dreschler Hurdle - 3600m • Mosstrooper Steeple - 3600m



The Mosstrooper Day is steeped in history. The Mosstrooper name adorns the Nursery of Champions Honour Board at the entrance to the Bendigo course. **Mosstrooper** broke his Maiden after 25 failed starts on 17th May 1928. He went on to become the most versatile and most popular champion jumper in Australian racing. Racing writers struggled to find superlatives to describe his performances.

In 1929 and in 1930 he won five and was an unlucky second from six starts in the elite jumps races in Australia. The VRC Grand National Hurdle and Steeplechase at Flemington and the VATC Australian Hurdle and Steeplechase at Caulfield. In that period he completed the VRC and VATC National doubles in one season. In his final race, the 1933 Australian Steeplechase over three and a half miles, Mosstrooper chased another champion **Redditch**, who at six was half his age, for the entire final circuit and caused him to smash the course record by four and a quarter seconds.

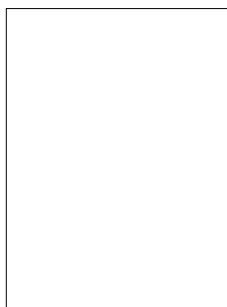

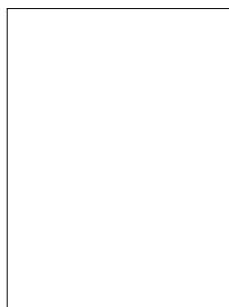

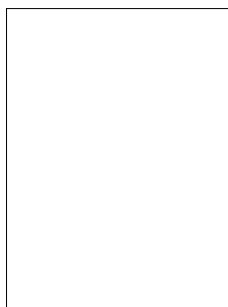
