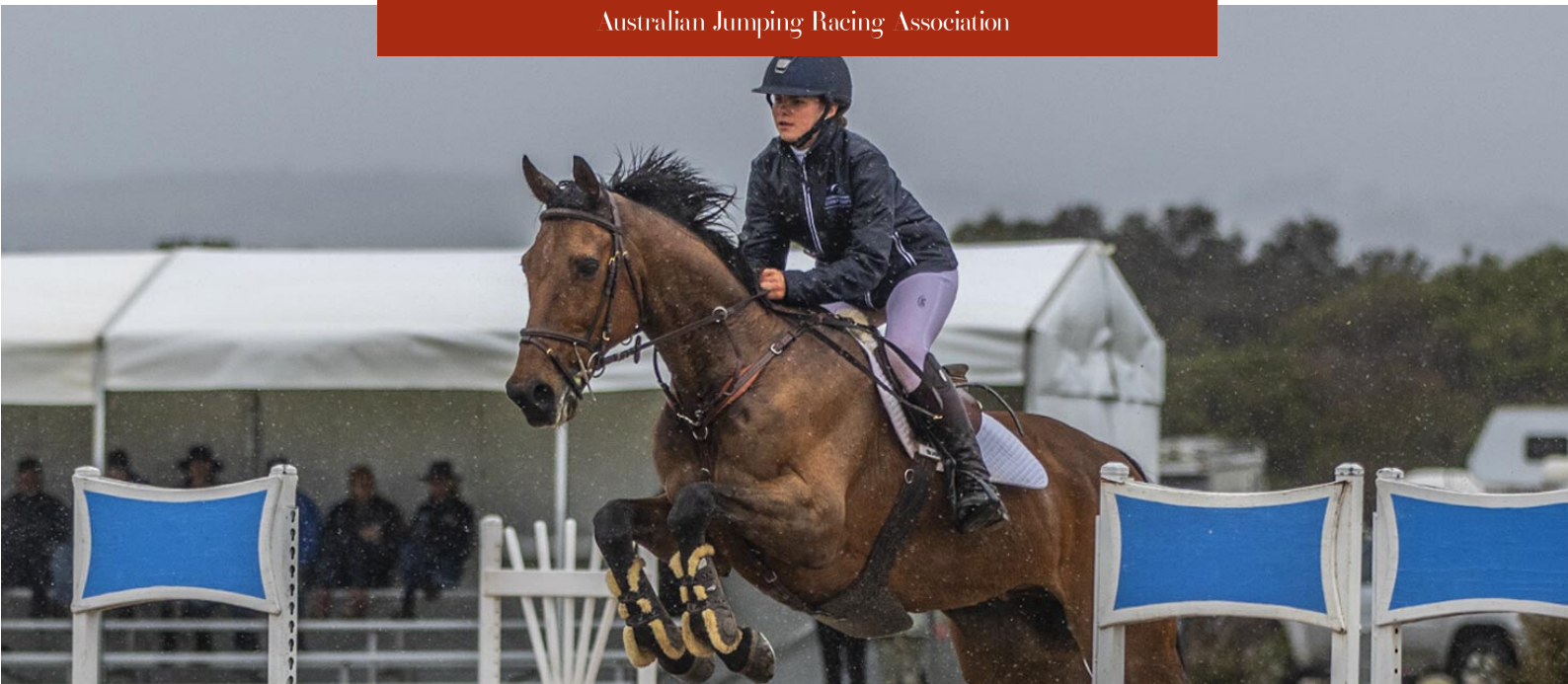

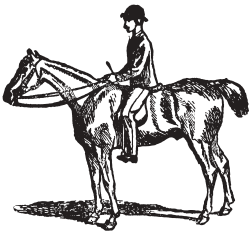

CORE MESSAGES

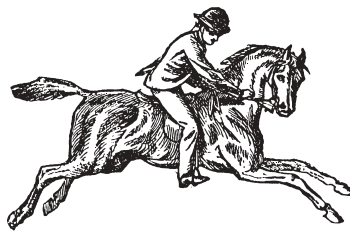
- Generally better temperament as staying bred.
- Older more experienced horses.
- The fact that they have had considerable amount of jumps schooling and other life experience i.e hacking out, cross country schooling, beach rides, riding in the bush, dressage work etc.
- Having a long jumps campaign over a number of years allows versatility as generally they have learnt more and with age, more sensible.
- Minimum race is 2 mile so a jumps horse has done more work than average horse.
- Can generally be trained for other disciplines because of their more relaxed attitudes and can be fairly agile and willing to please.
- Once a horse has had a jumping prep they soon learn to concentrate better.
- Being fit can be perfect candidates for performance.

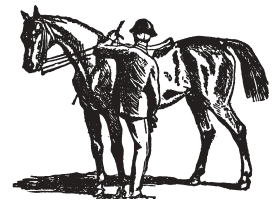

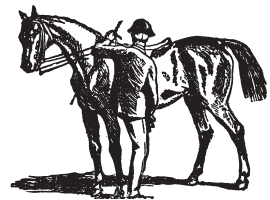
THE NEXT GENERATION

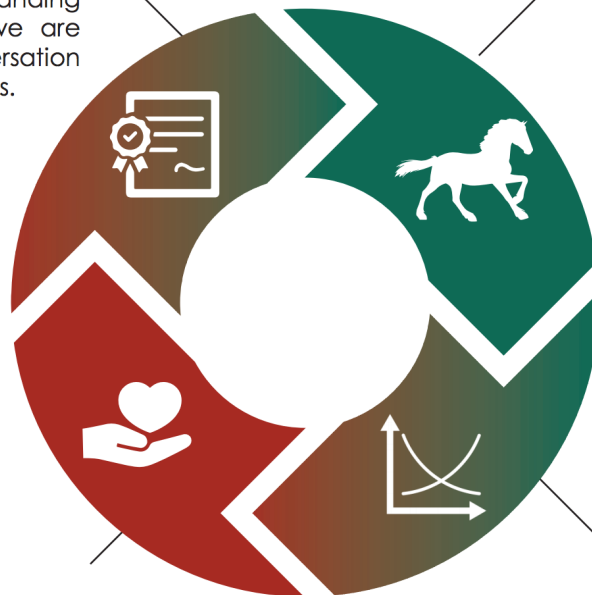
