Welcome to the Annual Australian Jumps Racing 2022-2023 Members Magazine. Thank you to all participants for yet another excellent jumping season in 2022 and we look forward to the 2023 season in Victoria. On behalf of the committee we would like to send a personal note to thank all, clubs, members and affiliated organisations for being thoroughly engaged with the AJRA. It has been an outstanding jumps racing season and we look forward to this years program.

We are committed to Racing Victoria KPIs being met to enhance a safer jumps industry for all horses and participants. We believe the AJRA's ongoing hard work and dedication to the sport will assist the increase of wagering, field sizes and participants.

The AJRA committee were pleased to see the support RV has for Jumps Racing which was proposed in their greens paper published in June. This paper was published for consideration and feedback by participants to create a 10-year Victorian Racing Infrastructure Blueprint which will be published by Racing Victoria this year.

The AJRA made a submission to strongly support the following

- 1. RV is proposing to retain jumps racing throughout the next decade and program races at those tracks currently conducting meetings subject to appropriate safety standards being maintained, Club support, and the availability of venues and horses.
- 2. RV is open to increasing the number of races conducted within the existing season window of March to August, subject to the support of owners and trainers in growing the jumping population.
- 3. A trend towards race meetings conducted exclusively with jumps and highweight races will continue should participation numbers warrant it

In relation to horse safety, we are pleased to share with you that with 66 races across the season in Victoria and with the introduction of new One-Fit Hurdles, designed to further improve safety for horse and rider, saw 2021 achieved the lowest fall rate in history down 66% on the 10-year average. This was

followed by the 2022 jumps racing season was among the safest ever conducted.

The 2023 season will feature 19 jumps meetings throughout Victoria from March to August – six of which will be held exclusively for jumps riders – with 42 hurdle races and 24 steeplechase races programmed prior to any divisions.

Following a significant prizemoney uplift of over \$850,000 in the 2022 season, the 2023 program will see an additional \$175,000 in prizemoney dispersed across four of Victoria's feature jumps races taking the total amount on offer to just under \$5 million.

In 2022 we worked with Racing.com and TRP in adding additional cameras and enhancements to the coverage of jumps racing on television. In 2023 we look forward

to continuing these efforts and assisting in enhancing the coverage even further.



At the start of the 2022 jumps season three stars Gold Medals, Ablaze and Zed'em all were retired seemingly one after the other so there was some trepidation as to how the year would pan out.

The only big name who would be returning in 2022 was champion hurdler Saunter Boy.

Jumps fans needn't have worried as what ensued was one of the most successful jumps seasons in recent years and one which will be a building block for years to come as potential star jumpers appeared and some promising young jumps jockeys put up their hands for the future.

There were also some well-known jumps trainers returning to the fray for the first time in several years to the sport.

Any look back on the 2022 jumps season though must start with the one horse, jumper or rider who stood out above the rest and that was Saunter Boy.

The tough grey from the Ciaron Maher and David Eustace stable, raced by Australian Bloodstock established himself as the best hurdler to have raced for many years winning his five feature starts over the jumps.

His feats were acknowledged at the end of the season as he was voted the Champion Jumper award at the 2022 Australian Racing Awards. He was also named the J.J Houlahan Hurdler of the year.

What did he do? Well - everything he could have achieved he did.

He won the five of the six feature Hurdle races on the 2022 calendar and each one he contested: the Bourke Hurdle and the Dreschler Hurdle at Pakenham, the Galleywood Hurdle at Warrnambool and the Australian Hurdle and the Grand National Hurdle at Sandown Lakeside.

It was his last win in the Grand National Hurdle (4200 metres) at Sandown Lakeside where he crowned his greatness on August 7.

On that occasion Saunter Boy carried top-weight of 71 kilos in the Grand National Hurdle and he also had to defy a late challenge from St Arnicca who carried seven kilos less to make it five wins from five starts in 2022.

In the past 20 years only another champion Black And Bent has carried a bigger weight to victory.

Saunter Boy has won his past six hurdle starts and eight of his last nine. He has won 10 of his 13 starts and has won every feature hurdle race on the calendar and he has also won two Australian Hurdles.

The Grand National Hurdle was also memorable as it gave Maher and Eustace and the unofficial trainer of their jump's horses, Declan Maher their third straight win in the race having won it in 2020 with Ablaze and 2021 with Wil John.

The Maher brothers were quite emotional after the win which demonstrated what Saunter Boy meant to them.

After the race Ciaron Maher repeatedly used the adjective phenomenal to describe what Saunter Boy had achieved.



"That's what's so special about the jumpers. They come back year after year and get better; they get stronger and tougher. To carry that sort of weight over that trip was a phenomenal effort to do it from the front," Maher said.

Saunter Boy's rider Steve Pateman also added another line to his glittering CV with his fifth win in the Grand National Hurdle which is now a record.

Pateman won four Grand National Hurdles in a row between 2011 and 2014 and Saunter Boy was his first since then.

In the weeks leading into the Grand Annual Steeplechase at Warrnambool, the Maher and Eustace stable lost their number one contender in 2020 winner Ablaze, but they had a more than worthy replacement waiting in the wings in Heberite who took out the event at only his second run over the fences.

Heberite also carried the same colours as Ablaze as their managing owner is Rod Lyons who also races gun sprinter Nature Strip.
It was an historic sixth win in the race for the former Warrnambool boy Maher which is a record for a trainer in the 150-year-old event.

Maher said for him the Grand Annual is the race he wants to win the most every year. "It's unbelievable. I think it's the best race on the whole calendar, well it is to me anyway," Maher said.

The win also gave former Irish and American based jumps jockey Willie McCarthy his first win in the race at his first ride in it.

McCarthy gained the ride as Steve Pateman couldn't make the weight of 64 kilos.

McCarthy in turn had to waste to get down to that weight and had to endure a pumpkin soup diet for the week leading into the race.

"Unfortunately, he was out of Steve's (Pateman) weight category, it was a bit light for him, and I'm absolutely privileged to get the opportunity to step in when he can't do it," McCarthy said.

McCarthy said Heberite's performances at his second run over the fences was unbelievable and he would only get better with time.

Heberite defeated the local chaser Police Camp by a length and a half with the Declan Maher trained Eyes Are Blue two and a quarter length away third.

McCarthy was also back in the spotlight on the final day of the jumps season on August 28 when he won the Ecycle-Solutions Grand National Steeplechase (4500m) on St Arnicca in a slogging finish holding out the star Kiwi fencer The Cossack at Ballarat.
The victory also gave Horsham trainer Paul
Preusker his second win in a row in the Grand
National Steeplechase having won it in 2021
with Inayforhay.

Remarkably Preusker pulled off the same training feat as last year as St Arnicca followed in Inayforhay's footsteps winning the Grand National Steeplechase at his fencing debut.

McCarthy said after the Grand National Steeplechase making the move to Australia had provided him with the highlights of his riding career despite also having had great success in Ireland and in the United States.

In less than 15 months of riding in Australia, the 39-year-old won 13 jumps races from 58 rides. He also won the 2021 Grand National Hurdle on Wil Jon before his two feature wins in 2022.

McCarthy will ride here for the remainder of his career which he hopes will extend to the end of the four-year visa he has.

McCarthy also shared the Tommy Corrigan Medal with another of his Irish compatriots in Richie O'Donoghue who amazingly tied for the award after his first full season of riding.

The 24-year-old O'Donoghue was one of the great success stories of the 2022 season as he won seven jumps' races in his first full year of riding to finish equal second in the Jumps Jockeys Premiership as well.



The Irishman said he couldn't believe that success he had had and was thrilled to be riding winners for his biggest supporter in Eric Musgrove who had really encouraged him.



"Without Eric I wouldn't be having this run at all. He's given me so much advice and support," he said.

Musgrove had another good season with seven winners and his team was led by his super tough mare Onset who raced throughout the year having 14 starts over the jumps for three wins, a second and four thirds.

Symon Wilde dominated his local Warrnambool May carnival with his highlight providing the quinella in the Brierly Steeplechase with former Kiwi Vanguard prevailing over Britannicus.

Vanguard was ridden by former English jockey Will Gordon and gave him his biggest success in Australia.

"We bought Vanguard to target this carnival, some stable clients jumped in, and Britannicus was a second-hand horse who is having a great career. We've got every inch out of him and he's doing a terrific job," Wilde said after the race.

Wilde also trained Count Zero to take out

the Cally Hotel Hurdle and he also quinellaed the Maiden hurdle with Rider In The Snow defeating Tolemac.

For Wilde those successes in May set up a big year for him as he went on to win 13 races and secure a win for the first time in the Australian Jumps Trainers Premiership over Maher and Eustace by one winner.

One member of the Wilde stable, Elvison, continued his love affair of the picturesque Casterton circuit winning the three feature races held at that circuit. In each win he was

ridden by Aaron Kuru and he led throughout each time.

Pateman again had a stellar season being a runaway winner of the Jumps Jockeys' Premiership with 15 wins and he also took out the J.J. Houlahan Champion jumps rider award.

Pateman also made inroads as a trainer winning the Mosstrooper Steeplechase at Pakenham with Valac and also the Ecycle Solutions J.J. Houlahan Hurdle (3250 metres) at Ballarat with former Irish hurdler Bell Ex One.

Bell Ex One demonstrated his international jumps prowess at his Australian debut as he could boast a win at Punchestown and a placing at Cheltenham.

The hurdler was purchased by AJRA chairman Sandy McGregor who also owns the Houlahan Hurdle runner-up Stern Idol.

The victory gave Pateman his biggest success as a trainer and his first winner over the hurdles.

Pateman said Bell Ex One could be a star in the making.

On the final day of the season at Ballarat, Henry Dwyer completed another good season with his small jumps team when Brungle Bertie won the Ciaron Maher Racing Steeplechase BM120 (3400m) but he couldn't find a suitable jockey. Dwyer's other jumpers Riding High and Budd Fox also had good seasons.

On the final day of the season at Ballarat his jumper Castrofrancaru showed his potential with his win in the Gotta Take Care Hurdle (3600 metres) continuing the comeback of John Leek.

For many years John Leek was a force in jumps racing. He won three Great Eastern Steeplechases (River Amos 1988, Vinchiamo 1992 and Boxter Blue 2004) and a Grand Annual Steeplechase with Vinchiamo in 1992. He also won the Grand National Steeplechase with Team Heritage in 2004.

Leek virtually walked away from racing for the past decade after brushes with officialdom but this year he came back and he's keen to put his stamp on next year's feature races.

Leek said it was a big effort by Castrofrancaru to win as he lost over three lengths when a horse fell with 1000 metres to go and he was hampered in the incident. Leek said Castrofrancaru would be a better fencer and he was aiming him for the Brierly Steeplechase and the Grand National Steeplechase next year.

His wife Andrea Leek also trains another promising jumper in Heir To The Throne who won two jumps races later in the season.

The final day at Ballarat provided a mouth-watering taste of what was to come in 2022 with Castrofrancaru, Bell Ex One, Symon Wilde's Fabalot and also St Arnicca each showing they could be stars next year.

Add in the return of Saunter Boy, Heberite and Vanguard it promises to be a stellar year.

AJRA invest in project to improve the broadcast of **Jumps Racing**


In 2022 AJRA on behalf of the clubs worked with Racing.com and TRP to enhance the coverage of jumps racing. 2023 we look forward to continuing these efforts and assisting in enhancing the coverage even further. A snapshot of the improved results.

Warrnambool May Carnival

- → Additional camera and operator utilised to capture in-running shots in Brierly paddock and also tight racing shots along the back straight
- → LiveU utilised to conduct additional interviews from vantage points like the hill, tie up stalls, and the unique insight provided by Shane Jackson at Brierly Paddock going through strategies in races and also looking at the jumps themselves
- → Slow motion camera
- → Shane Jackson used as an expert commentator Casterton Cup Day
- → For the first time ever, Casterton Cup Day was elevated to become the feature race meeting for coverage

Grand National Hurdle Day

- → Shane Jackson used as mounting yard expert Great Western Steeplechase Day at Coleraine
- → Shane Jackson used as on-course correspondent and expert
- → Interviews conducted with club personnel, trainers and jockeys
- → Additional camera used to capture inrunning close-up shots



- → With a talent presence on course, we captured the fun and excitement both on and off the track
- → The day included feature interviews with a number of jockeys and also utilised additional cameras around the course to provide tight shots of the races, capturing the undulations and scenery at the racecourse
- → Shane Jackson used for expert insight on runners and to conduct interviews
- → Significant wagering uplift for the meeting year on year Mosstrooper Jumps Day at Pakenham
- → Additional camera installed at course to better showcase the spectacle and highlight the athleticism of horses and riders
- → Extended mounting yard previews conducted at this meeting when not done in previous years as the secondary meeting on the day Grand National Steeplechase Day at Ballarat
- → Two talent on course, including Shane Jackson, to provide insight and the highest possible level of coverage speaking with key participants across the day
- → Additional in-running camera utilised to enhance live coverage

What is the Racing Victoria Jumps Review Panel?

The function of the Jumps Review Panel is, among other things, to provide clear direction regarding matters that the Panel may take into account when considering the qualification of horses to race in jumps races. The Jumps Review Panel take the following points into account when qualifying a horse;

- Competitiveness.
- Jumping ability.
- Placing in trial.
- Fitness to race over long distances
- Overall performance and condition.

The Purpose of the Racing Victoria Rider Skills Coach

In 2019 a jockey coach & jockey training programs were implemented to improve experience & ability. Successful and ongoing into 2023, a rider skills coach is engaged by RV to provide hands-on coaching and training to riders; review rides and falls; provide feedback and reports to the Jumps Review Panel. The Rider Skills Coach will be required to attend trials and races throughout the season.

In 2023 the successful schooling one day program will be implemented at Pateman Racing for it's purpose to consolidate and improve the skills of the current team of Jumps Jockeys.

- It will address the "fall rate" & potential for incident.
- It will serve as an opportunity for riders to school over various obstacles and at various speeds; thereby increasing their skill before, during and after landing over obstacles.

Furthermore a pilot program was conducted by

Racing Victoria in 2022 following consultation with the AJRA, VJA and RV's Equine Welfare and Workforce Development teams. The objective was to improve jump racing safety by supporting upskilling of jump jockeys with 'out of saddle' development.

There was a high level of attendance and engagement in the program in 2022 and a review at the conclusion of the program resulted in Racing Victoria offering a program in 2023.

This year the field testing, strength and conditioning sessions will be conducted by the Victorian Institute of Sport, this will be followed by the opportunity to receive feedback and assistance in the design of a strength and conditioning program for all jockeys attending.

Victorian Institute of sport's field testing comprises of several strength and endurance tests and measures body mass. This will provide a baseline and comparison data allowing jockeys to identify opportunities for improvement.
